Editor's Note: An eye-witness account of the Agency collapse which cracked open Nazi Marshal Rommel's Egyptian defenses is given here by Frank L. Martin, Associated Press correspondent who has been on the front lines since the North African campaign was launched thirteen days ago.

FRONT — (Delayed.) — The engine of Alamein line is crumbling tonight. It cannot hold on much longer. The coast road leading westward, where their first line is being pulled back. The withdrawal started in the north sector, which had been held for a week and a half when the tank units were ordered to retreat.
