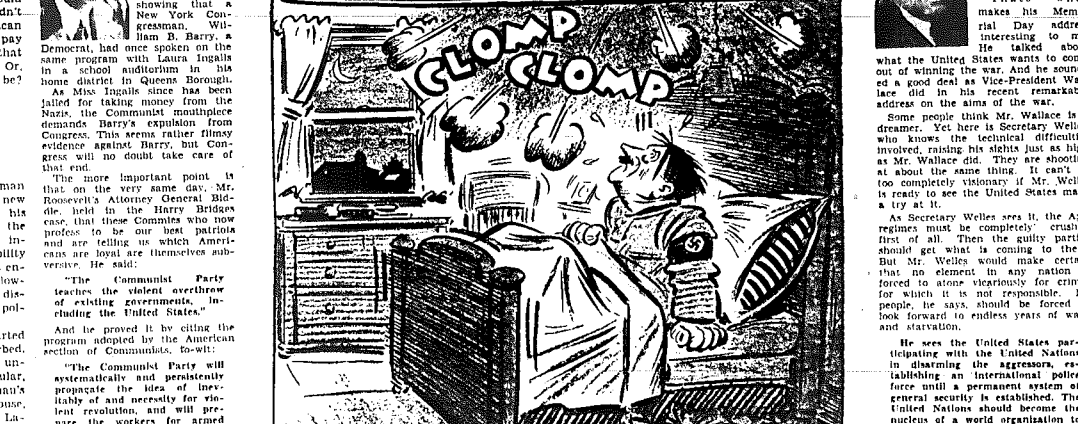
Sex: The Most Bestial Nazi Weapon
