LONDON—(AP)—United States and British staff officers are seeking some means of aiding Russia through a limited diversion on the continent in second front conferences which will continue for some time, it was reliably reported today.

Prime Minister Winston Churchill, who initiated the second front, in Washington in December, 1941, and continued there during his June visit again met with British and American officials.

There has been much emphasis on the need of maintaining the northern supply routes to Russia.

British economic experts have predicted that the United States and Britain may have to increase rationing to send Russia supplies.

With these considerations before them, Allied strategists might choose limited landing in an area in northern Norway where the Army would be able to strike at U-boat bases and airfields impeding Russian-bound convoys.
