

Speak It Out In India

THE first anniversary of the Atlantic Charter should have been an important event; but it was muted under the turbid news from India.

The noble words give off just now a slightly hollow ring against the noise of the Ghandi campaign for immediate independence.

These noble words will continue to have a hollow ring until some way is found to square the position of the United Nations in the East with our professions of belief in a free world.

President Roosevelt notes the anniversary of the Atlantic Charter by sending a message to the Viceroy of India, Churchil, reminding him that in the fight for the great ideals of a free world we fight shoulder to shoulder.

But at the same time we have to fight shoulder to shoulder with the British against the Ghandi trouble-makers. American troops are ordered to stick to the business of prosecuting the war, which in that area is defined in the order as having the primary aim of giving aid to China.

The confusion and embarrassment are obvious. They will continue until the relations between Britain and India are readjusted. The Atlantic Charter has been interpreted by President Roosevelt to apply throughout the world.

Until London decided to send Cripps to Delhi, there was some question whether Prime Minister Churchill considered the principles of the Atlantic Charter as applying to India.

After the Cripps mission, the British attempt was made to reach a solution and Ghandi renewed his effort to obtain independence by sabotage and blackmail.

The present subject status of India, the failure to arrange something that more approaches a free status is inconsistent with the aims professed in the Atlantic Charter.

Americans are in one sense intruding on a private affair between Britain and India when they concern themselves with the matter.

But in another sense it is a matter that affects all of the United Nations. The fact that American troops are in India suggests that this country does have some kind of interest in the matter.

It is not that we could or should try to tell Great Britain what she ought to do. But the common cause of victory over the Axis gives us a legitimate interest in wanting something done to eliminate this open sore in the side of the United Nations cause.

Military security requires that the British put down this rebellious challenge, and it is difficult to see how anyone on the side of the United Nations could wish Ghandi's attempt to be successful.

Neither is it easy to see how anyone who wants our side to win can be blind to the necessity of getting our cause on a firmer footing in the East.

We are branded there as imperialists, fighting to regain the right to exploit the riches, backward, colonial lands of the East. Native populations everywhere except in the Philippines and Free China have remained indifferent or become hostile to our side.

It is still nothing more than the noble words, backed by colonial lands to convince them otherwise. Nobodies renounced anything out in the East.

The necessity of a better relationship between the democratic powers and the peoples of the East would seem to point to the desirability of dealing with this task as soon as order has been restored in India. It may be more difficult now than it was last Spring when Cripps tried it. But we can afford to try. Indeed, we can't afford not to try again.

By the CIO, and other professional liberal elements, are crying out that the new tax bill "soaks the rich."

Short Order Industry Does A Job

DEVELOPMENT by the steel industry of a new series of alloy steels for making war goods has been announced by the American Iron & Steel Institute.

The new steels will be designated as the N. E. (National Emergency) 2600 series. The alloying elements used are, in general, small amounts of silicon, chromium, nickel and molybdenum.
