# Exciting Speculations

Raid, Expedition or Invasion, the Attack On Dieppe Quickens a Country's Pulse

Whether the landing-in-force at Dieppe is a major Commando raid, a feeling out of German defenses or the first phase of the big push itself cannot at this hour be told. There are a number of factors which seem to indicate that it is more than a raid. For one, it continues on into the French afternoon after a beginning well before dawn. Commando raids are usually nocturnal affairs exclusively. And Commando raids are not announced until the forces have returned home. This one has already been the subtlet of communications and of vasion. On the right flank below Dieppe a landing party silenced a German battery of six guns, blew up an ammunition dump and, having accomplished its mission, re-embarked. Troops which have come with the purpose of staying are not re-embarked. On the oliter hand, it is significant that this intelligence as to the disposal of forces on the right flank should have been given out while fighting continued to rage in the center and on the left.

The participation of American troops could mean everything, little or nothing. One thing, however, that it does mean for certain. Whatever this action portend, whether it be a beginning or an end in itself, the presence of our own countrymen gives us an extraordinary stake in it. May they lay destruction about them and themselves fare well. Altogether, for whatever it may be, the action against Dieppe is a thrilling heartening implementation of the promise to relieve Russia of the pressure which is concentrated against her, and a manifestation in its own right of the united Nations will to carry the fight to Germany, as to the ultimate character the operation, we shall have to guess until we know for certain. ## Speak It Out In India

WASHINGTON THE first anniversary of the Atlantic
Charter should have been an important morale event but it was mutifelt
under the turbulent news from India.

These noble words will continue to have a hollow ring until some way is found to square the position of the United Nations in the East with our professions of belief in a free world.

President Roosevelt notes the anniversary of the Atlantic Charter by sending a message to Prime Minister Churchill, reminding him that in the fight for the great ideals of a free world we fight shoulder to shoulder. But the British against the Gandhi trouble-makers. American troops are ordered to stoke to the business of prosecuting the war, which in that area is defined in the order as having the primary aim of giving sid to China.

The confusion and embarrassment are obvious. They will continue until the relations between Britain and India are readjusted. The Atlantic Charter has been interpreted by President Roosevell to apply throughout the world. Until London decided to send Cripps to Delhi, there was some question whether Prime Minister Churchill considered the principles of the Atlantic Charter as applying to India. After the Cripps mission fealled, no further attempt was made to reach a solution and Gandhi renewed his effort to obtain independence by cabotage and blackmail.

The present subject status of India, the failure to arrange something that more approaches a free status, is inconsistent with the aims professed in the Atlantic Charter. Gandhi's present treachery is one thing. The neglect of the problem itself is something else.

Americans are in one sense intruding on a private affair between

Britain and India when they concern themselves with the matter.
But in another sense it is a matter
that affects all of the United Nations. The fact that American
troops are in India suggeste that
this country does have some kind
of Interest in the matter.
It is not that we could or should

ought to do. But the common cause
of victory over the Ads gives us a
legitimate interest in wanting somehing done to eliminate this open
sore in the side of the United Natons cause.
