Raiders Hit Nuernberg And Saar Steel City

THIRTY BOMBERS LOST IN ATTACK
LONDON.—(AP)—Nuernberg, a great war industries center, and the rally ground of Hitler's Nazi Party, and the Saar steel center of Saar-Lotharingen were attacked heavily by a strong force of British bombers which left large areas burning in both cities at night.



THE HEAVIEST ASSAULT WAS ON Nuernberg, the Air Ministry said. Thirty bombers were lost from the "large force" which perhaps explored hundreds of miles of which packed eight tons of explosives each.

RAIDERS HARASS AXIS Mediterranean Ships
LONDON.—(AP)—British submarines in the Mediterranean, pursuing their campaign against German and Italian shipping, have sunk a large tanker and a large supply ship and scored torpedo hits on three other supply vessels, the Admiralty announced today.
