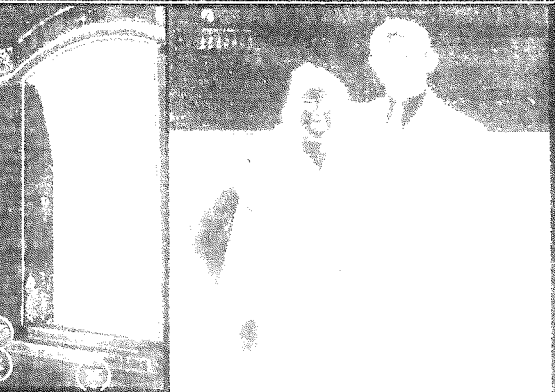
Called From Court By Assailant

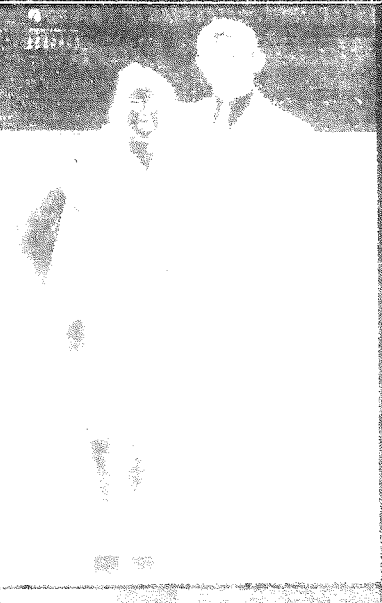
PRINCIPALS IN SHOOTING—One of the most sensational sniping attacks here in recent years occurred today on the steps of the City Police Department.
