Big Jap raids on our bases have shown that the enemy still has plenty of sirpower here and that Allied raids have not been powerful enough to knock out the foe's airfields. Allied airmen continue their attacks on Jap convoys north of New Guinea, but the threat to Australia is emphasized by reports of concentrations of Jap warships, aupply vessels and transports at Raboul and Truk. In addition, the enemy is said to have 200,000 troops massed in this area.
