Army Eats Mountains of Food; Keeps Much More in Reserve

The mammoth task of feeding the fighting forces of the United States at home and abroad was brough! home to us the other day by the mera sight of eight figures. With one look, the need for rationing, an increasingly stringent rationing, becomes apparent

need for rationing, an increasingly need for rationing, becomes apparent to anyone:

When a soldier goes into a camp in this country, the commissary puts aside for him senough food to supply five civilians. And when a soldier is sent to foreign soil, the commissary sets aside arough food for him to meet the country stored in great warehouses all over this country, at central points and at ports, but also at the point of the soldier's destination.

Wherever the soldier goes, a veritable extream of foodstuffs follows him and precedes him. There is no taking chances with the Army, Many tisses the normal amount must be guaranteed in case of loss of ships, or in case of enemy capture. Always, many food depote must be established far behind the men, in case the enemy captures a forward base.
