WASHINGTON — (AP) — American planes bombed Japan's Aleutian base at Kiska thirteen times on Saturday, the Navy reported today, causing a heavy explosion at North Beach, the mouth of Kiska Harbor, and a Japanese outpost damaging the airplane runway.
