### Greek Rioting Touched Off I Yankee Raids

Turkish dispatches last night said the street disorder broke out Sunday, and a Greek source in Ankara expresse the view they undoubtedly were touched off by the hearten ing effects of American air raids last week on airfields nea Salonika and Athens.

The Axis took quick and ruthless counter-measures against the Greek rioters, an informed Balkan source reported. Hundreds of the demonstrators were said to have been arrested and many shot down. A number of others were believed scheduled for the firing squad.

This source said the demonstrations centered in Athens and Salonika, upon which American air raiders last week showered thousands of leaflets containing an encouraging message from President Roosevell, and in Volos and Larisa, near the east coast.

A German motorized division was said to be taking up posts along the Solonika Peninsula, and a German news agency reported the Rumanian Cabinet had decided upon partial evacuation of Bucharest as an air raid precaution. Bern dispatches quoted Lyon advices to the Trib-une De Geneve as authority for the report that Field Marshal Rommel has taken charge of the defenses in France. Rommel was declared to be stationed at Mont-dore, from where he is said to set out frequently down the Rhone Yalley to inspect "vast aviation fields under construction."
