Allied Troops Storm and Take Town of Eboli, 16 Miles Inland

ALLIED HEADQUARTERS IN NORTH AFRICA—(AP)—Italian Liberators threw new weight into the conquest of Italy by bombarding a historic part of Venice as French troops and native guerrillas proceeded today to mopping up German resistance on Corsica and the U. S. Fifth Army registered new gains in the Salerno beach head.

French Reported In Corsica's Capital

City of Ajaccio Said To Have Been Occupied After Battle With Germans
LONDON—(AP)—French troops were battling on the soil of Metropolitan France today for the first time since the collapse of the republic in the Spring of 1940 as Commandos from North Africa fought side by side with patriots of the mountainous island of Corsica against the German garrison.

Fast French Destroyers Take Part In Landing Of Troops On Corsica

AJACCIO, Corsica, Sept. 19.—(Delayed)—A series of fast naval operations, reminiscent of the blockade running, American Civil War days and executed in twentieth century style by warships of the French Mediterranean Fleet, opened the gates of Corsica today.

Threaten Nazis At Smolensk
LONDON—(AP)—Blasting into the Smolensk defense zone to outflank the German central front anchor, Red Army forces stormed on today from captured Velizh, 65 miles to the northwest, while further south they had slashed across the Kiev-Chernogov highway and cut the main Crimean escape railway between Zaporozhe and Dnepropetrovsk.

Nazi Firms 'Unloading' Great Offensives

Apparently Expecting Early Fall of Italy
WASHINGTON—(AP)—Big German industrial concerns, apparently convinced that all Italy soon will be in Allied hands, are trying to unload in neutral countries their shares in Italian companies. The shares in Italian companies were disclosed today as the United States and British warred all neutrals against acquiring such shares or other enemy assets in Italy.

Salerno Called German Defeat

Madrid—(AP)—Spanish correspondents in Berlin said today that the Salerno campaign in Italy had been a military and propaganda defeat for Germany and made these other statements and predictions, remarkable both for their content and origin:
The German Ukrainian administrative government already is evacuating Kiev.

Yaps Attack Guadalcanal

WASHINGTON—(AP)—Japanese planes raided American positions on Guadalcanal today and minor casualties, damage reported today. The raid, the third in a week upon Guadalcanal, apparently was of the nuisance variety and probably was carried out by bombing planes on a reconnaissance mission.

JAP SHIP LOST IN A SHOWER OF BOMBS
