Both Roosevelt and Secretary Hull felt that we had appeased Japan long enough; that during this appeasement Japan had reached out farther...

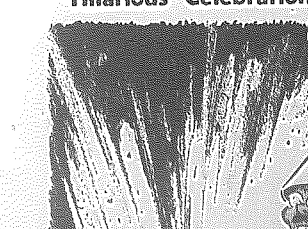
Secretaries Knox and Stimson, however, felt that U. S. was not prepared and that the note to the Emperor would bring war.

This is not, we assume, the free America most people think we are fighting for. In this new instance there is a strong call for some kind of union activities...

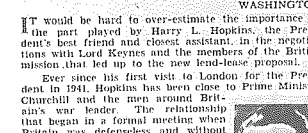
