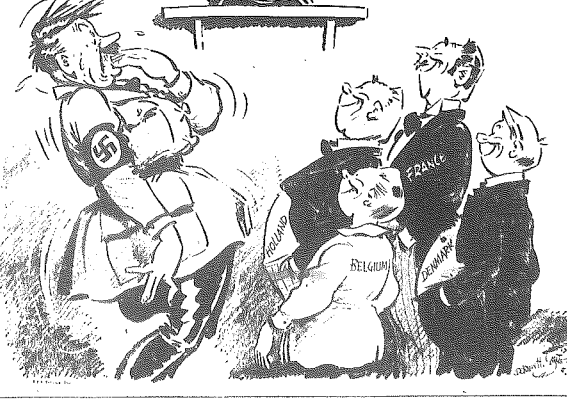

HOW can one find the date of Easter fifty years ago or fifty years from now? A correspondent has written in asking for the date of Easter in 1880. The answer is March 29. The Prayer Book of the Protestant Episcopal Church has in it a table showing the date of Easter from the year 1788 to the year 2133. By consulting this table one can calculate the date of Easter for any of the Church Festivals which revolve around Easter, commencing with Ash Wednesday and continuing through to Whitsunday or Pentecost.

Since the second half of the century has passed, it is not by effect that Easter should fall on the first Sunday after the first full moon on or after the Spring equinox, which is March 21.

This table was adopted by both the Alexander and the American Churches. They likewise adopted the entire Julian Calendar system of the four seasons of our solar calendar today.

By 46 B.C. the Roman Calendar had settled two months on the top of a year. The year of Julius Caesar set up a commission which also adopted a plan of the calendar which was in use by the Romans at that time.
