

Stock Extends Gain; Cotton Trade Cautious

CHARLOTTE, Oct. 20—(By wire)—While prices changed were mixed, today's stock market continued to show underlying stability with volume down from the average of recent days.

Irregular from the outset the market was about even on fractional gains and losses near the fourth hour. Rail had a little better support than other groups.

Buying interest in the general run of industrial leaders was marked by some real interest, indicating doubt in the minds of speculative followers as to the market's ability to sustain a rise without undergoing a corrective reaction.

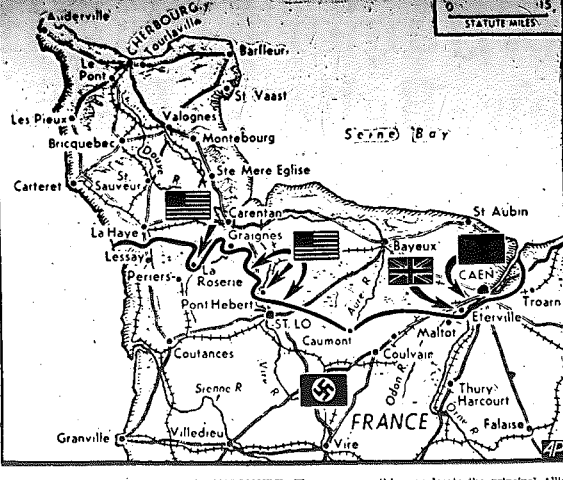
