Estimates Set Loss At \$2,000,000

Shipyard, Resort Areas Hard Hit

WILMINGTON — (AP) — The tropical hurricane which struck the Wilmington shipyard and resort area last night caused property damage around \$2,000,000.

Fishermen and docks were destroyed, several houses were destroyed and 25 people were injured.

BEACHES EVACUATED — So far as could be ascertained, several hundred people from the beaches scattered storm casualties were hospitalized in Wilmington.

Ties With Berlin Broken By Turkey

LONDON — (AP) — Turkey aligned herself with the United Nations today to the extent of breaking off diplomatic and economic relations with Germany and there were indications that powerful Soviet Russia soon would consider a new Finnish request for an armistice guaranteeing Finland's independence.

BERLIN — (AP) — Germany officials had nothing to say immediately on the Turkish action, but officials said its "attitude will be forthcoming only when the official message asking proper reasons for Turkey's step are received in Berlin."
