# PARIS IS SURRENDERED BY GERMANS

Resistance  
Is Ordered  
Stopped

Order Signed As  
Commanders Meet

PARIS.—(Delayed)—(AP)—The final unconditional surrender of Paris was signed at 6 P.M. tonight in a bare, dimly lighted meeting room in Montparnasse railroad station in Paris.

Seized in this conference at an obscure railroad station were the commanding general of the Paris garrison, commander of the Paris police force, chief of state arms, Gen. Louis Léger, and Gen. A. J. Georges, commander-in-chief of the Paris defense forces.

"Resistance in the military district and defense units is illegal," said the chief general of defense.

Parisian leaders who immediately were given to the last officers who were deemed to be American, British and French writers in the city have been

ordered to leave the city.


