Huge Carrier Attacks May Be Underway

By U. S. PACIFIC FLEET HEADQUARTERS, PEARL HARBOR.—The crushing might of the Third Fleet aircraft carriers, whose deep penetration of enemy waters has Japan warning of major war developments, may have fallen for the third straight day on Formosa and the Ryukus.

An ominous radio broadcast today by the fleet strongly suggested that possibility of hitting two atonishlands at once, indicating even greater attacks over than that on separate days against the same targets last October.

That much, but little more, was confirmed, yesterday, by Chester W. Nimitz in a communique which said the details "are not yet available."

The circumstances surrounding the present attacks are such that the most concentrated aircraft carrier blow of the Pacific War may well be in progress.

That the carrier was cleared for retention of the Philippines the carrier had the added responsibility of knocking out the enemy air force in the Philippines ahead of Gen. Douglas MacArthur's Leyte-bound troops.
