Bolling testified yesterday that at Meadows' request he endorsed a college check for \$500.00 and gave the check back to Meadows. Bolling said that Meadows told him the money was to be used for the purchase of land instruments.

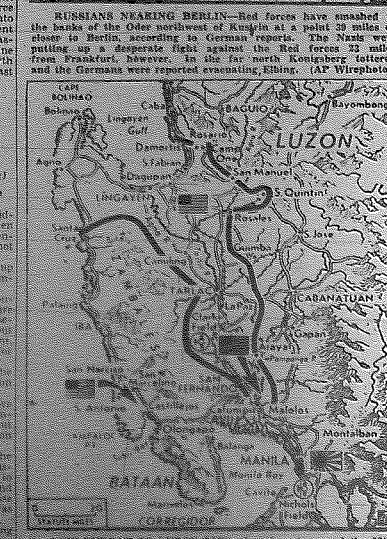

westward on the Bataan Peninsula from San Fernando and captured Subic Bay. This represented a ten-mile advance in which 20,000 Japanese troops, including 10,000 Japanese troops, were reported to have landed without bloodshed Monday.

Such a junction will seal off the Japanese from the Bataan Peninsula, which is the western shore of Manila Bay. Japanese troops have landed from Subic Bay and other sectors to the north, and some are reported to have landed from the Bataan Peninsula.

MacArthur announced the severing of the Subic Bay highway, which is the main highway of the central Luzon plains left in Japanese control. The capture of Munoz and Talavera, First Corps Yanks seized the road town of Tarlac, at the northern end of a Manila highway skirting the eastern side of the central Luzon valley. They also were closing in on Lingayen and Lupa, to the south, on the same highway.

Japanese pockets in the Port of Subic Bay area north of San Fernando have been cleared after days of bitter fighting. MacArthur announced.

Heavy bombers pounded the Cavite Naval base with 57 tons of bombs which caused heavy explosions and fires. The base had been a prime target since before the Jan. 9 invasion of Luzon at Lingayen Gulf.

U. S. Warships Said To Be Nearing Corregidor
