JAGGED WEST FRONT—Rampaging armored columns of America and Britain are rip-sawing remnants of collapsed Hitlerite forces. Several Yank tank and motorized infantry are specding 25 to 50 miles daily. Canadians are driving upon Emden, great German North Sea port. Britons, beseiging Bremen, surged across the Aller; menacing Hamburg. By-passing Brunswick, spectacular Yanks dashed across the Elbe, speeded onward, 50-odd miles from Berlin. Other Yank mechanized columns slashed from Nordhausen into Halle area, driving for Leipzig. From Erfurt area, famous American tank divisions also set speed record in push toward Leipzig, likewise aiming at junction with Russians. Americans On Homestretch To Nazi City

Hell On Wheels Division Of Ninth Army Forces Last River Barrier

PARIS —(AP) — A report attributed to French sources and without immediate confirmation said to-night that Allied parachute troops had been dropped at Brandenburg, barely 20 miles west of Berlin.

PARIS — (AP) — American Ninth Army tanks crossed the Elbe River today and debouched onto the flat, unbroken plain leading 57 miles toward Berlin and 115 miles from Russian siege lines.

A front dispatch said ft. Gen. William H. Simpsen's men could reach the Brandenburg gate in Berlin by to-morrow night or Saturday, provided the Germans awitched no tank forces from the east. One report, however, said the Germans indeed were shifting their battered Sixth Pancer Division from the Eastern Front.

The last river before the German capital was forced by the Hell on Wheels (Second) Armored Division which blazed more than 50 miles to Magdeburg in a 12-hour dash yesterday. The precise site of the crossing was not announced.

LEIPZIG APPROACHED

The First Army approached Leipzig in Saxony over the old battlefields of Frederick The Great. One uncon-firmed report placed American tanks near Halle, 15 miles from Leipzig. Planes destroyed or disabled 120 German tanks near Halle.

Cities fell like tenpins: Weimar, Heilbronn, Essen, Coburg, Nordhausen, Schweinfurt, Halberstadt, Emmen, Neustadt and—by German account—Bochum.

Lt. Gen. George S. Patton's Eleventh Armored Di-vision was less than 40 miles from the border of Cacch-slovakia tonight. Patton's forces swept across the Saale River south of Jena.

The day's gains brought Patton's men to a point south of Naumburg, which is 128 miles from Russian lines.

The Saale River crossings were made at points along a 30-mile stretch by the Fourth and Sixth Armored Divisions. BRITISH SHELL BREMEN

The British thrust within less than 50 miles of Ham-our, Germany's greatest port and second largest city, capturing Celle (25,000) and Rethen, crossing the Aller River. They were shelling Bremen, second German port.

All along the Western Front, it was a hound and hare chase of disorganized and shattered German armies who had lost their last water barrier before Berlin, the Elbe.
