The Crest

A decided relaxation has come about in Army and Navy manpower policies. Week or so ago the Navy, which has insisted that its task in the Pacific would requires all the men available to it, cut back its monthly draft quota from 32,000 in April to about half that in May, with further reductions in sight.

The reasons for it were two: fewer casualities than expected, and heavy enlistments of seventeen-year-olds. This same enlistment advantage, which the Army has waived, enables the Navy to grab off the very type of youngster which the Army needs for combat replacements, compelling draft boards to call up older, less adaptable men to meet Army quotas. Even so, the Army too is talking reduction. It's already official that enlisted men over 42 (as distinguished from commissioned officers) will be discharged upon their request. There are some 50,000 of this description. Unofficially, but on good authority, the Army is said to be expecting about mid-year to begin inviting discharge requests from non-regarders envice. It is indicated, however, that the Army will exercise its own hard-boiled discretion as to which men are dispensable, and the chances are that there will be no large exodus.

Even so, it is apparent that there has
