Patton Moves To Liquidate Final Pocket

Two German Armies Surrender As Nazis Fold Fast In Europe

PARIS — (AP) — Virtually all resistance to Gen. E enhower's forces ended today and Gen. Patton's Third Army smashed into Czechoslovakia in a knockout offensive against the last German troops still fighting the Western Allies in the South.
