GUAM — (AP) — Large numbers of Japanese leaped to their death from the cliffs of southern Okinawa today and more and more were surregudering as U. S. tanks and troops broke through to the south shore.

Two Martine regiments soized 700 yards of the south coast as they fauned out, an artillery spotter plane pilot said he saw many Japanese or civilians leaping into the sea in the first mass suicides since the Saipan campaign.
