PEICH MARSHAL GOERING, as his notebook shows. occasionally diverted his mind from war and political intrigue to deal with matters of purely personal interest to people who came to see him.

An example was on Oct. 12, 1938, when he received Frau von Essen, wife of a former Swedish Minister to Berlin. A page and a half of his notebook are taken up with this discussion, which concerned her daughter and son-in-law, Baron Goldschmidt-Rothschild.

There is a long list of family details including the past and present activities of its various members mentioned, Goering's notes conclude with the words: "She pleads that her children shall be allowed to keep their passports for travelling abroad."

The next day Goering saw Alfred Rosenberg, Nazi specialist on racial theories, and switched his mind to espionage and the complicated politics of Eastern and Southeasterr Europe.
