London Economic Meet

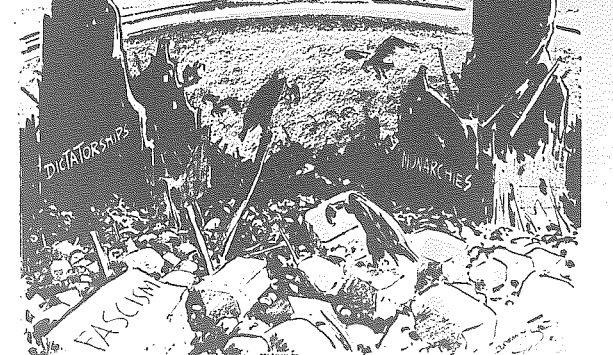

In the last war, late in September of 1918, the 30th led the breakthrough of the Hindenburg Line. With the 12th Infantry Regiment, 2nd C. National Guard in front, it plucked off near St. Quentin and opened the drive which crushed German resistance.

In this war, too, it started as a Carolina-Tennessee outfit forming as the first for the first time in the Summer of 1940 in Louisiana maneuvers. It came to Fort Jackson that Fall, but shortly its National Guard units were dispersed through other outfits.

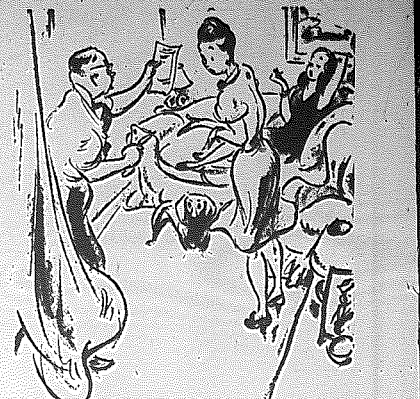
Time For Justice
