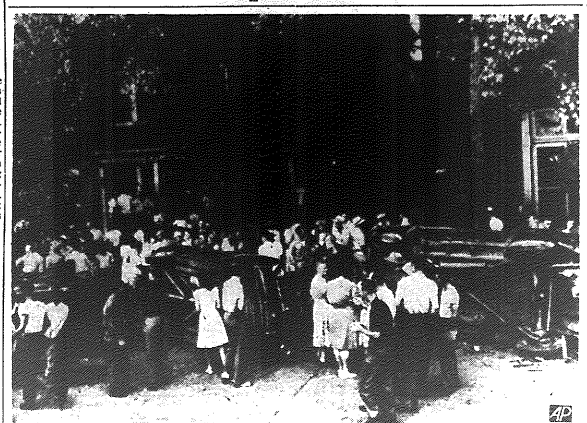


Hal Boyle Art School In Reich Is Popular With GI's
