# Senator Hoey Girds For Battle

THE Republican - dominated 80th Congress has produced another one of those equations so distressing to the Solid South: A determination to reduce expendi-South: A determination to reduce expenditures plus the fact that the South is the principal beneficiary of the Soil Conservation Service equals a major reduction in the Federal funds now available to Southern farmers in their battle to prevent the deadly erosion of their land.

Senator Hoey, we are pleased to note, has recognized this possibility in advance of the convening of Congress, and is already gathering support for a last-ditted defense of the soil conservation program. It's continuation means much to North Carolina farmers in dollars and cents—something like six and a half million dollars in 1947 to help them maintain the program of conservation that has been underway here for more than a decade. But it means a great deal more in terms of the future. Soil conservation experts believe that the present appropriation provides only minimum insurance against

wholesale devastation, and they can point to the rivers that still run red to prove their point that, despite all past quits, maillons of tons of invaluable land its being washed into the sea each year. If the present South-wide campaign against egg-sion is hampered by a sharp reductor fin appropriations, they warn, all the careful work of the past may be undone in a few seasons.
