As usual, they are waiting for someone
else to pay their way, but why aren't they
cager to do their part and more for their
own cause?

The people who are concerned about the future of their city and their country will be interested in a discussion of the growing political and ecosomic significance of the Community Chest which appears in the current issue of Neussect.

"The community fund is democracy in the illimitable field outside of government," Raymond Moley writes.

It is "a common effort which keeps alive the sense of shared obligations."

Anybody who has once seen tungsten can never forget it or mistake it. It is true that it does not come in nuggets, but it is im-bedded in gray quarts rock and it looks ex-actly like pieces of iniaid jet.

It is about the most heat-resistant and pressure-resistant metal known, and so its used to harden steel, make cutting tools or drill points, and absorb the heat in elec-ric lights, spark plugs and other electrical evices; it also comes in handy in the man-facture of armor-piercing shells and let-ropelled plane engines.
