WASHINGTON (AP)—The Senate Foreign Relations Committee today called for "speedy action" on a measure authorizing \$597,000,000 of aid for France, Italy, Austria to defeat the "twin spectres of cold and hunger accompanied by political chaos."

The measure was introduced in the Senate Wednesday by Chairman Vandenberg (R-Mich.) and Senator Connally (D-Tex.), ranking minority member. It had previously been unanimously approved by the 3-0 vote of the committee. Debate on the bill will start Monday.
