Says Both Are Needed To Furnish Health Program Gets Big Test

RALEIGH—(AP)—Chairman James A. Clark today said that the "substantial majority" of the North Carolina Medical Care Commission is convinced that the State should assume its responsibility in the field of medical education by expanding the present two-year medical school into a standard four-year school, and that an additional teaching hospital should be built and operated at Chapel Hill.
