General Carlson died this week in a Portland hospital, and, although the doctors wrote coronary thrombosis on his death certificate, he was a war casualty as certainly as if he had fallen before enemy

guns. His prodigious efforts in the Pacific wrecked his health and forced his retirement. But Evans Carlson immediately used his entire life to the military service of his country as a captain, field artillery in World War I...
