Why?" Fif-ty per cent voted for manual labor, 31 per sear for office, such and 19 per cent had cent for office work, and 19 per cent had

no opinion.

Even making due allowance for the fact that most parents believe their children are heavity endowed with special talents, this is a remarkable reaction. Those who voted for office work gave the usual reason—that white collar employment carriers with it more dignity and pressige. Those who voted for manual labor apparently regarded this factor as neglitely, and argued that a man with a trade stands

a much better chance of advancement these days.

The practical argument is sound enough, in a generation the manual worker has used the leverage of union organization to used the leverage of union organization to double and in many cases tribel his income. He has also shortened his working hours, improved his working conditions, and generally made his job as pleasant as it is profitable. The while-collar worker, on the other hand, has oaid for his independence by keepine his job at about the same economic level. 
