JERUSALEM (AP)—A dusk-to-dawn curfew was ordered today for 90,000 Jerusalem Jews, bringing to 155,000 the number of Jews under curfew restriction here, in Haifa and in the Nafatya area.

The action followed a new outbreak of violence which left three dead and 24 wounded in 48 hours. The British Army was ordered to lock in the Jewish quarters here from 7 P. M. to 5 A. M. daily "until further notice."
