Research For 'National Survival'

Research For National
JOHN R. STERLMAN, the Presidential Assistant, has presented an impressive
case for the Administration's program for
scientific research on a scale adequate to
maintain America's leadership in the
Atomic Age.

The Steelman proposal, contained in his
first report as chairman of the President's
Scientific Research Board, gives more concrete form to President Truman's objections
to the National Science Foundation Bill that
was passed at the last session of Compress.
In vetoling than the last of the president

on "national survival" and the scientific
knowledge required for pushbutton warfare, makes it crystal clear that the objection came from the military.
The new program, if it is carried out, will
mark another defeat for civilian scientists
who have opposed extension of military
control. In his statement, Mr. Steelman has

reminded Congress and the public of the hard facts that make this regrettable out-come inevitable. Arguments against a sci-ence geared to military needs, like objec-tions to universal military training, simply break down in the face of evidence that Russia wants no peace and is placing all emphasis on science in her effort to out-strip the United States in military and in-dustrial power.

Considering the circumstances and the times, the Administration's policy seems to have given maximum consideration to all factors. A balanced proforam, giving substantial encouragement to scientific re-Tactors. A balanced program, glving sub-stantial encouragement to scientific re-search and training in every field of our national life, while maintaining military research at 'high levels' for at least five years, is being evolved. The cost figure advanced—1 per cent of the national in-come, or an estimated \$2,000,000,000 a year— seems to be a very modest one consider-ing what we stand to gain from the pro-gram.
