Soviet Propaganda Drive Predicted

By JOHN SCALI WASHINGTON (AP) - An increasing violent anti-American campaign by Russian press and radio was predicted today by U. S. officials examining Moscow's propaganda line.

"They said the attack on President Truman in a Russian magazine which compared him with Hitler indicates a decision to 'cut all the stops'."

One official expressed belief that the Russians have given up any hope of winning favor from the American public and will concentrate now on trying to discredit the United States in the Soviet Union and abroad.

"The American Government disagreement came to light yesterday when the State Department announced that the Russian embassy in Moscow has emphatically protested criticism of the Russian press."

The Assembly then adjourned until later in the afternoon when balloting was to be continued. Earlier in the day, Czechoslovakia was reported to have had the support of both the United States and Russia...

Cut-Rate Export Proposal Studied

By OVID A. MARTIN WASHINGTON (AP) - The Government is considering a proposal that it offer some high-priced foods in hungry areas abroad at "cut-rate" prices as a means of preventing further advances in grain and livestock quotations.

"Such foods would include dried fruits, citrus juices, fats and oils, dried beans and peas, dried eggs and canned vegetables. A Cabinet Food committee reported to President Truman last week that this program would spare \$650,000,000 worth of these."

Under the cut-rate proposal, the Government would buy the food at prevailing market prices and sell it to foreign countries at prices which they would pay."

Foreign countries have followed a practice of spending what funds they have for grain, particularly wheat, because it provides the maximum amount of food energy for each dollar spent, it was said.

Solon Terms Emergency Question Of Survival

Calls Foreign Affairs Meet

WASHINGTON (AP) - Senator Vandenberg (R-Mich.) said today that in the matter of emergency aid for Europe "the immediate question is one of elemental human survival in a free society."

Vandenberg, the recognized Senate Republican spokesman on foreign policy matters, made that statement in announcing he had called the Senate Foreign Relations Committee to meet Nov. 10 in accordance with a request from President Truman's request that the Senate and House committees explore Western Europe's urgent Winter needs for food and fuel."

"This proposal is submitted separately from plans dealing with long range economic recovery and a study of \$600,000,000 fund for European Winter aid before he holds special session of Congress."

Explaining why he had not called the Senate Foreign Relations Committee to meet, Mr. Vandenberg said the State Department "will not be ready with concrete proposals until November 1st."

He added that "other essential reports, including findings of Congressional committees, relating Europe, and also the report of the Hartman Committee to the question of aid for Europe, will not be available until that time."

Secretary of Commerce Harriman is directing a study into the question of whether to suspend the United States embargo on the export of grain to Europe without injury to its own economy.

"The fourth committee is House agriculture. Mr. Thayer (D-N.Y.), chairman of it, is now in Europe and is not expected back until the end of the month."
