Soviet Given Opportunity To Accept Compromise

PARIS (AP) — Foreign ministers of the United States, Britain and France offered Russia a new opportunity today to end the Berlin blockade on the basis of the six-nation compromise which Russia vetoed Monday in the United Nations Security Council.

They announced in a joint communique they intend to leave Berlin question on the Security Council agenda.

The decision came after a 70-minute meeting of Secretary of State Acheson, French Foreign Secretary Ernest Bevin and French Foreign Minister Robert Schuman at the Marshall Hotel.

The six-nation compromise was ready to continue to fulfill its obligations and to discharge their responsibilities as members of that body (the Security Council) which is the only international organization with the authority to enforce any development in the situation.

The six-nation resolution provided that the four great powers remove restrictions as to the movement of goods.

The four-hour stoppage yesterday was ordered by TWU International President and City Councilman Michael J. Quill and his supporters. They sought to show the State Public Service Commission they meant business in demand for payment of back wages.

ABOARD TRUMAN CAMPAIGN TRAIN — (AP) — President Truman said today he has no doubt rents will go up at least 20 per cent next March if the Republicans win the election.

The President made the statement in New York City, where he sought voters in Industrial New England with an assertion the GOP favors rent control next March, open shop, yellow-dog contract policies.

The latter statement was made at Pittsfield, Mass.

At Hartford the President said the real estate job market predicts rents will not be increased more than 20 per cent if it succeeds in killing rent control next March.

"I don't have a doubt in the world that rents would be that high, or maybe even higher, if the Republican Party should win this election," he said.

WANTS PRICE CURBS — Mr. Connecticut with former OPA Administrator Chester Brown, Democratic nominee for Governor of that state, advocated price controls and continuation of rent control after the housing emergency is over.

13 Germans Acquired

Will Be Reviewed

WASHINGTON (AP) — The United States, Britain and France agreed today to a full review of the reparations allocations of German industrial plants.

A joint statement made public by the State department today said, however, that Britain and France had turned down the U. S. request for a temporary halt in plant dismantling pending the review.

Marshall Plan Administrator Paul Hoffman rejected the resolution by the three nations to stop dismantling certain plants while he sought to co-operate in every way with the American committee.

The three-power statement made no mention of any step in dismantling. It said "a list of plants" will be studied by a U. S. committee which would be done with them.

State Dept. officials in attempting to State department made plain, however, that dismantling of the questioned plants will continue. Deliveries of the dismantled parts to the allied countries will stop until a definite decision has been reached.

While the investigation is in progress, other plants not under the dismantling program are to be reviewed. The three-power statement said it added.

ECA Freezes New Loans

WASHINGTON (AP) — The Economic Co-operation Administration, announced today it will make no new Marshall Plan grants to European countries unless they have signed loan agreements.

The action temporarily cuts off new grants, or outright gifts, of recovery aid to France, Italy, Denmark, Norway, Sweden, Belgium, Iceland, The Netherlands and Turkey.

These are the countries eligible for ECA aid on a repayable loan basis, with whom negotiations have been in progress for months.

Exempted from the cut-off order are nations whose economic condition is such that ECA is not required to sign up for loans. These include Austria, Greece, Trieste and the allied zones of Germany.

The halt in new grants will not stop shipments under grants already made.

The British yesterday signed a loan agreement for \$110,000,000, and Iceland also is exempt from the new ECA decree because she concluded a \$23,000,000 fisheries credit in the Summer.

2 Killed, 11 Hurt In Train Wreck

URRICHVILLE, O. (AP) — The engineer and fireman were killed and 11 other persons injured today in a head-on collision between two passenger trains.

The dead were identified as Gordon C. Aley, 64, of Pittsburgh, Pa., and Charles A. Hart, 46, of Ingram, Pa., the fireman.

The truck driver, Gregory Karavak, 41, of Cleveland, was seriously injured and was taken to a hospital at nearby Denison.

Twelve other persons, three of them passengers, were treated at the scene by doctors summoned from surrounding towns. Dr. D. M. Corbett, Tuckersville County coroner, said none was injured seriously.

Russians Assert Gunny Rights

BERLIN (AP) — Soviet military officials in Berlin today said they can hold gunny practice in the airfield corridor of Berlin when the allied control council is in session.

According to the Soviet-licensed German news agency ADN, the Russians denied the existence of any four-power agreement on air safety rules for occupied Germany.

ADN's version of the Soviet report said the Russians contended air safety rules cited by the Western powers had never been confirmed or approved by the council and therefore were not valid.
