Gerhard Eisler Plea To Be Considered

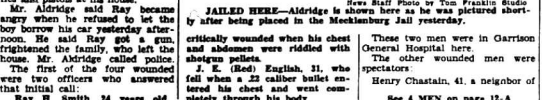
WASHINGTON (AP)—The Supreme Court today agreed to consider an appeal by Gerhard Eisler, German Communist, from conviction of contempt of Congress.

State Asked To Pay For Hospital At University

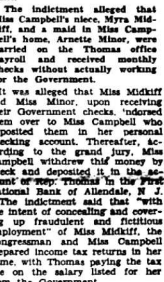
RALEIGH (AP)—A request that the State assume practically the entire cost of building a teaching hospital at the University of North Carolina was made to the Advisory Budget Commission today.
