It only went 120 feet, but this plane was airborne 45 years ago and there was a photographer there to record it on film.

The above photo is the only existing picture of the historic first flight by the Wright brothers at Kill Devil Hill Dec. 17, 1903. Orville Wright is stretched out on the lower wing of the plane while his brother, Wilbur, runs alongside.

The Wright brothers spent \$1,000 to construct this first plane, and its total flight was not as far as the wingspread of present-day passenger planes, now built at costs exceeding \$1,500,000.
