Police Hunt Woman in Death Case

Companion Of Victim Sought

Jack G. Williams, Franklin Hotel proprietor held for the fatal shooting of an ex-bus driver here yesterday, waived preliminary hearing in City Police Court today on a charge of murder.

He is held without privilege of bond for appearance in Mecklenburg Superior Court on charges of killing John Augustus Rogers, 34.

Williams has already made preparations for his defense, through lawyer Henry Baker, who is attempting to have Rogers' body returned to his family for a funeral.

The shooting occurred yesterday afternoon at 3:15 when Rogers, whose car was parked in front of the hotel, was shot by Williams, who had registered at his hotel on the night of September 24.

Detectives John W. Bowers and Roy Smith, who are assisting in the search for the woman, said they had no leads at this time.
