Strong Armed Force Urged To Back Palestine Plan

Adequate Support Is Asked By N. Group

Partition Pushed By Commission

LAKE SUCCESS — (AP) — The Palestine Commission decided today that the United Nations plan will partition the Holy Land to fair unless adequate armed force is provided to back up the commission's made-up representatives of the five smaller members of the Nations Council to provide such a force, presumably on an international basis, before May 15.

"The commission," its members said last night, "has decided to refer to the Security Council the problem of providing that armed assistance which alone would enable the commission to discharge its responsibilities."

It is charged with ending the British mandate over Palestine and with building the foundations for separate Jewish and Arab states there by Oct. 15.

There was no immediate reaction from the United States, the only U. N. body which has not yet sent an Army into Palestine. The members called the report to their home governments for study.

Indications were that the commission would open debate on Palestine a week from today. Should the commission request the United States to send an Army to Palestine, the members called the report to their home governments for study.

"The commission will be unable to establish security and maintain law and order, without which it cannot implement (Nov. 29) resolution of the General Assembly unless military forces adequate strength are made available to the commission when the responsibility for Palestine is transferred to the British administering authority on or before May 15."

It is the considered view of the commission that the military forces of the mandatory power should be replaced by an adequate non-Palestinian force.

Experts on diplomatic language felt the commission went as far as it could without making a specific demand that the Council set up an international force.

PROGRAM STALLED Where the Council would get an international force was another question. The U. N. charter provides for permanent U. N. Army, Navy and Air contingents but the agreements mainly between the United States and Russia have stalled this program.

Any Council action along these lines apparently will have to come under Article 42 of the Charter which says that if sanctions and other measures are made ineffectual by the use of force, the Security Council may take such action by air, sea and land forces as may be necessary to maintain or restore international peace and security.
