An eighteen-year-old Wadesboro boy, charged with forcing a young Charlotte man to drive from Charlotte to a deserted spot outside Dallas, N.C., at the point of a gun late last night, is being held by City Police for investigation of a charge of kidnaping.

Whittle T. Morris, who gave his address as Route 1, Waverline and Royal Pines, was arrested at about 4:30 A. M. in Gastonia by police authorities there and returned to Charlotte early today. He is being held for investigation in connection with the kidnaping of Clifford Lockwood, 29-year-old electrical's helper, 805 Berryhill St.

M. last night, and had stopped with his pockets full of cash and saws of \$427 in his car, and was being held at the station on North Fourth St. at about 3 o'clock this morning. Both men being held were identified by J. J. Burns, night manager of the station at the time he drove in the back seat of a car and all for their car, had two men and a woman in the car, and away without paying for their purchases.
