Dynamiting Fish A Felony

SOUTH CAROLINA sportamen, tired of Seeing the lakes and streams of the state criminally blasted of their fish, have got behind a law which is really tough. Sponsored by the Horry County delegation, a bill was passed by the General Assembly and signed by Governor Thurmond.

For the first offense, a sentence of one
year is mandatory: for the second, two
years, and for the third, three years, Judges
must pass sentences as outlined. Persons
so sentenced are specifically barred from
provisions of the Probation and Parole Act. provisions of the Probation and Parote ac. In addition, a convicted person loses his hunting and fishing licenses for five years. The bill was approved by the Fish, Game and Forestry Commission.

The law also makes it criminal to aid. abet or assist in dynamiting fish, having dynamite in a boat used for fresh water fishing, and picking up fish within two hours after they have been dynamited.

Failure of a witness to report dynamiting within two weeks is a misdemeanor. Wit-

nesses giving testimony are exempt from prosecution for slander or any civil action for damages. This law isn't fooling. It goes much further than the one in effect in North Carolina, according to Joe Withers, district game protector of the State Wildlie Commission in Charlotte.
