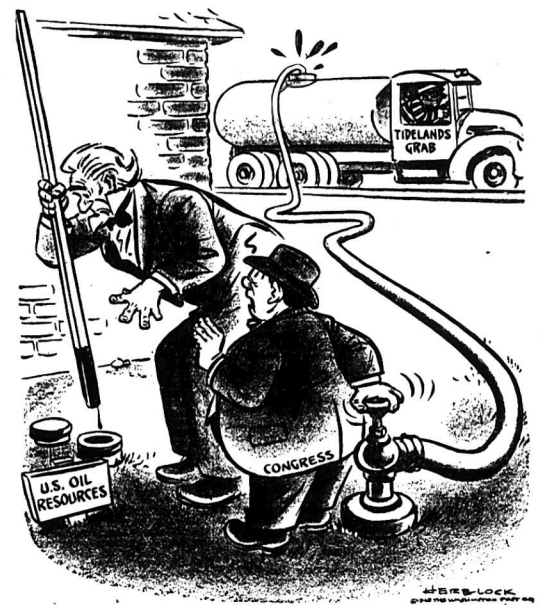


Fumbling On Chance For Peace
