Davidson Will Settle With Wilson College \$500,000

Controversy Ironed Out, Trustees Of School Told To Begin Gym This Summer

DAVIDSON — The Davidson College Board of Trustees was told today that all controversies relative to the Baxter Davidson estate had been settled and the estate had been added to the college endowment fund, giving the school an addition of approximately \$500,000.

The E. L. Baxter Davidson will be contested by relatives of Mr. Davidson, but the suit was settled last October. It was unofficially reported that the contesting heirs were in a suit for some time back. The will, except for requesting the property at 104 N. Tryon St. to the widow and for some small bequests, left the large bulk of the estate to Davidson College.

The trustees, as reported by F. L. Jackson, college treasurer, at the regular Spring meeting of the board of trustees, reported that the budget for the next year had been balanced, and that there were "small additions" to each account.

The trustees also were told that construction would begin by mid-June on the new \$600,000 gymnasium. The board authorized construction of an apartment house, to cost \$100,000, and \$100,000 for the new members of the gym facility. This structure will include six one-room units. It is to be built by Berger Brothers Construction Co. of Knoxville. Construction is to begin immediately.

BETTER AID — The board also recommended improvement in the Fine Arts Dept., particularly in art, dramatics and speech. This recommendation was made as the result of a national comparative survey recently made all over the country.

Dr. John R. Cunningham, president of the board, said that \$25,000 of the Carnegie Foundation. These include Dr. J. G. O. Frazier, \$10,000; Dr. Tom Dagg, \$10,000; Dr. F. F. Johnson and Dr. C. G. Galloway in history; Dr. J. R. Davis in chemistry; Dr. G. S. L. Pritchard in physics; Dr. O. Guernsey in international relations; Dr. C. E. Abernathy in sociology; and Robert Needer in music.

Two new trustees were added to the board: Dr. Daffin of Lincoln, S. C., and Dr. L. R. Andrews, Jr., president of the Asheville Presbyterian and Dr. E. L. Pritchard, president of the Asheville Presbyterian.
