WHAT SOFT of a foreign policy may we expect from a Dewey Administration if the Republicans win the Norember election? Interest in the subject is raised further by the persistent rumor that John Poster Dulles of New York, and not Senator Van-denberg, will become Dewey's Secretary of State in the event the New York Governor is elected President.

Mr. Dulles has been Governor Dewey's adviser on foreign affairs and his influence on American polleymaking under the bipartisan foreign polley arrangement has been considerable. In any event, the Russians broke up the conference, Since then we have proceeded with a plan to establish a federated German state in the Western Zones controlled by the United States, Britain and France. that the British Cabinet has been called into special session twice in twelve, hours. Whether the Allies can hold their postition in Berlin without resorting to warlike measures is a question. Even if they succeed in maintaining their footholds in Berlin, there is growing evidence that the creation of two Germanys will produce nothing but chaos in Europe. We thus are advanced so vigorously by Mr. Dulles and the results to date do not speak well for the foreign policymaking we may expect from a Republican Administration.
