Three Others May Give Up Nine Of Twelve Indicted Communists In Custody

NEW YORK — (AP) — The ninth man of a group of twelve indicted members of the Communist Party's national committee surrendered today to Federal authorities. He was Irving Polach, manager of the CIO Furriers Joint Council. All twelve are charged with advocating overthrow of the U. S. Government by violence.

WILLIAM Z. FOSTER Thompson, New York State party chairman; Gilbert Green, Chicago district party chairman; and Gus Hall, of Cleveland, Ohio State Communist chair-

man — indicated the three soon will surrender voluntarily.

Ball for the seven who appeared in Federal Court here yesterday morning, was provided by the Civil Rights Congress. The congress also reportedly posted bond for Carl Winter, chairman of the party's Michigan county who appeared in court in Detroit.

The congress is on a list of groups named by Attorney General Clark as subversive. William Z. Foster, national Communist Party chairman, and the party's general secretary, Eugene Dennis, also indicted, defended themselves at a news conference.

Southerners May Visit White House Before Fall

WASHINGTON — (AP) — President Truman said today that he will talk with Democratic leaders of all opinions in advance of the Presidential campaign. He told news conference that he is ready to talk with whatever group Senator J. Howard McGrath, Democratic national chairman, brings to the White House. McGrath said after a conference with the White House yesterday that representatives of divergent views will be included in the group, he planned to bring in. Mob, Police Seek Negro At Chester

CHESTER, S. C. — Approximately 30 police officers including city and county officers and State constables, and a partially armed mob estimated at 200, early this afternoon were combing the woods around Baldwin State, a textile suburb near here, for a Negro man, about 30, accused of making indecent proposals toward two white women on a nearby highway this morning.

Made Improper Advances

The two women reported separately that the Negro made indecent proposals to them between 10 and 11 o'clock this morning. One of the women was described by officers as a young housewife. "The first woman, according to reports from an informant in Chester, said the Negro stopped her on the highway but that she escaped in a nearby car. "It is reported that the Negro continued to walk down the highway and high school and other white women, then repeated his proposals. This woman also escaped as the Negro ran into woods nearby. Police Chief M. C. Chandler of Chester said the Negro was still at large and the search was continuing.
