Americans in the last few days have directed two tateks against the United Nations, the more speciacular of which was the one-man bombing raid on Lake Success conducted by a former turret gunned in the United States Air Forces.

The pilot, who dropped a home-made bomb on the headquarters of UN Thursday, did much less damage to our international peace agency than the Congressmen and State Dephriment officials who earlier created consternation at Lake Success when they broadcast charges that UN is being used as a screen for foreign subversive agents.

Authorities have identified the flier as a citizen of Willington, Conn., who, we are tool by a member of his family, "has been pretty upset, seeing the world on the edge of another war." His solitary expedition to Lake Success is a sensational demonstration of the haywire mood of these critical times.

In the case of the wayward pilot, we have a glaring illustration of several reasons for UN's great difficulty in restoring sanity to the world.

One is that there are too many citizens who have plans to save the world but no clear idea of how to manage even themselves.

A second point is that virtually all the peace plans being offered today call for the use of force. Like the program of the Willington crusader for world order, they begin with a bombing.

Third, fear of the word "appeasement" has grown to the proportions of a phobia which blinds our people to the purposes and the good work of UN. That organization was designed primarily as an instrument of appeasement, and it is dubious that UN will ever have any real police authority unless it first succeeds in asserting its moral influence over all the big authority unless it first succeeds in assert-ing its moral influence over all the big powers. It has labored diligently to inspire the appeasement mood in Russia and its failure to date on this score does not mean it can never persuade the Soviet to see rea-son.

The Communist would be stupid indeed if they did not see that they can do more to promote a GOP land-side by working for a split in the Democratic Party than by voting for Mr. Dewey.

The great danger is not that the Wallace bolt may result in the defeat of Harry Truman and many liberal Democratic candidates in the Congressional elections in 1946. Apart from itse cristic performance in the election of 1298, it has shown tenter to be a somewhat the state of the control of the publican candidates. In both positive and negative ways, the race issue has appared to be somewhat less hotly controversal in North Carolina, than in some other Southern communities.

Such considerations might tend to minimize the disadvantage of a Republisan Presidential candidate in solletting North Carolina's approval. Incidentally, the outcome of Gov. Dewey's projected attempt to win it would afford one interesting measure of the South's reaction to the Texan Peter Molyneaux's thesis, that it could best promote its own special interests by going Republican from time to time in national elections, beginning this year.
