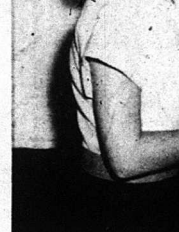

New Iron Machine Shown

ANN ARBOR, Mich. — (AP) — A new type of "iron lung" that fits like a fishbowl over a polio victim's chest and allows him unprecedented freedom of movement was introduced here today.

The new respirator, four hundred times lighter than the old-style lung, was demonstrated by Dr. Dornman E. Lichy, a pediatrician who aided in its development.

He said the new device has been successfully used on polio victims at the University of Michigan's contagious hospital here. One patient, Charles Cooper, 26, who had been added, lived in the glass gadget for two-and-a-half years.

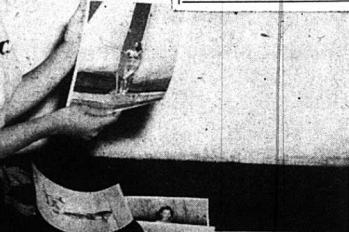
