Tito To Open His Country To Refugees

By MARQUIS CHILDS. Charlotte News editorial page columnist, now in Europe. TITO'S YUGOSLAVIA... Tito has announced that he will open his country to refugees from Albania, Bulgaria and Hungary...

Asked about "Titoism" in neighboring countries, Tito said he has been the scene of carefully staged trials. Tito's round and frequent travels have suddenly become notorious. There is said to be no speaking of Titoism.

"We here in Yugoslavia are following the true Marxist doctrine, both in principle and application, and as it relates both to our internal affairs and our relations with other nations."

TITO said that the forthcoming trial of Traicho Kostov, former Bulgarian premier, will mark the "traitors" with charges aimed at Yugoslavia. The pattern in Sofia, Tito declared, will be followed in Hungary where László Rákóczi is being tried.

MARSHAL Tito repeated today through an official spokesman that there is no possibility of a Soviet-Yugoslav pact in Moscow. However, he would say that there is anything as a Soviet-Yugoslav pact.

Tito Scraps Albanian Pact
