When he heard the news of the Executive Committee's action, Mr. Blythe immediately telephoned his public office before but that he had been unable to get to the committee at the instance of his brother's friends and his own.

After Mr. Blythe had been nominated and a motion was made to elect him, the motion was carried to submit the name of Mr. Joe L. Blythe, uncle of the Senator.
